About the Kumbh Mela of Prayagraj (Allahabad)

The Kumbh Mela in Prayagraj is distinctly different from Kumbh Melas held at other locations for several reasons.

- First and foremost is the tradition of Kalpavas, which is unique to Prayagraj.
- Secondly, the scriptures regard the Sangam as the center of the earth.
- Thirdly, it is said that Lord Brahma performed a Yajna here for creation.
- Fourthly, Prayagraj is revered as the king of all pilgrimage sites.

However, the most significant aspect is that the spiritual activities and penances performed here are considered more fruitful than in other sacred places.

According to the Matsya Purana, the great sage Markandeya states that this location is especially sacred to all deities. Spending a month here, maintaining purity, and practicing Brahmacharya while meditating on one's deities and mantras can fulfill all desires.

A devotee who bathes here can liberate their ten generations from the cycle of birth and death, achieving salvation. Even serving the pilgrims here helps one overcome greed and attachment.

Thus, adorned in traditional attire, the saints and ascetics engage in diverse spiritual activities at the Sangam, drawing many onlookers who are eager to witness these sacred rituals. The Kumbh Mela transforms the Sangam area into a temporary city spanning thousands of hectares for nearly 50 days. This age-old festival maintains its extraordinary essence. Despite modern pressures and the rapid spread of urbanization, the Kumbh Mela continues to honor the rivers, acknowledging their status as the Mother of the World.

Deeply rooted in the consciousness of the Indian populace, the unwavering faith and devotion of the people is the nectar of life. Their immortal beliefs remain steadfast in times of crisis, symbolized by the "Akshayavat" (the eternal Banyan tree). Knowledge, renunciation, and the essence of spirituality are embodied in the Sangam, with the foundation of Dharma being Prayagraj.

HISTORY

Kumbh Mela: The Kumbh Mela is celebrated once every three years on the banks of the following rivers:

- Godavari in Nashik
- Shipra in **Ujjain**
- Ganga in **Haridwar**
- Sangam (the confluence of the Ganga, Yamuna, and Saraswati) in Prayagraj.
- Ardha Kumbh Mela: The Ardha Kumbh Mela is held every six years in Haridwar and at the Sangam in Prayagraj.
- **Purna Kumbh Mela:** The Purna Kumbh Mela occurs once every twelve years, determined by specific planetary alignments. This grand congregation takes place at all four sacred locations: Nashik, Ujjain, Prayagraj, and Haridwar.
- Maha Kumbh Mela: The Maha Kumbh Mela is a once-in-a-lifetime event, held every 144 years (after 12 cycles of Purna Kumbh). It is celebrated exclusively at the Sangam Ghat in Prayagraj.
- Spiritual Significance of the Kumbh Mela: The sacred rivers associated with the Kumbh Mela are believed to be the places where drops of divine nectar (Amrit) fell during the churning of the cosmic ocean (Kshira Sagara). Devotees who attend the Kumbh Mela take a holy dip in these rivers to receive divine blessings. It is also believed to be an ideal path to attaining Moksha (liberation from the cycle of birth, life, and death).
- Key Bathing Dates (Shahi Snan): The most significant aspect of the Kumbh Mela is the Shahi Snan, or Royal Bath, which occurs on specific auspicious dates. These dates are known as the main bathing days and attract the largest gatherings of devotees. The Shahi Snan dates are determined by astrological configurations and are considered the most spiritually potent times to bathe in the holy waters of the Triveni Sangam.

Here are the key bathing dates for the Kumbh Mela:

- Paush Purnima (Full Moon in January) (January 13): A significant day for devotees to commence their ritual bathing, marking the beginning of the pilgrimage season.
- Makar Sankranti (January 14): Marks the transition of the sun into the zodiac sign of Capricorn. It is considered a highly auspicious day for taking a dip in the holy rivers.
- Mauni Amavasya (New Moon) (January 29): One of the most important bathing days. It is believed that on this day, sages and saints observe silence and meditate, enhancing the spiritual atmosphere.
- Basant Panchami (Fifth Day of the Magha Month) (February 3): Celebrated to mark the arrival of spring, this day is associated with the worship of Saraswati, the goddess of knowledge and wisdom.
- Maghi Purnima (Full Moon in the Magha Month) (February 12): Another significant full moon day when devotees gather to take a holy dip.
- Maha Shivaratri (February 26): Dedicated to Lord Shiva, this day is observed with fervent devotion and is an important occasion for spiritual seekers.



- The train and flight reservation process has started; please proceed with booking your tickets. Kindly share your ticket details, as this will help other Yogis coordinate their travel plans accordingly
- If you are traveling by your own car, please inform us in advance so we can arrange parking. Additionally, if you are traveling with family, ensure that each member is registered individually.
- If there are any changes to your team, arrival or departure dates, or if your plans shift due to train or flight reservations, or any other reason, please update your registration with the new details.
- All Yogis are advised to carry standees (most Prachar Prasar teams will have a few) for realization at various locations. Please also bring Prachar Prasar materials such as leaflets, books, photos, portable speakers, etc.
- We are planning to print special T-shirts for Yuvashakti, priced between INR 300 and 350. If you're interested, kindly reply with your preferred size: Small (S), Medium (M), Large (L), Extra Large (XL), or Double XL (XXL)
- Transportation to the Accommodation Venue: We recommend using public transport such as pre-paid taxis or local buses to reach the accommodation. For individual travelers, bike taxis are also a convenient option
- During the Kumbh bath, major roads are closed, and all modes of transportation are restricted **??**, so you will have to walk.
- It gets very cold in the area during winter, with temperatures dropping to as low as 2 degrees Celsius. Therefore, bring appropriate warm clothing and a zz sleeping bag according to your needs.
- Make sure you have confirmed tickets for your arrival and departure, as it may be difficult to manage without them during the fair.



How To Reach Prayagraj



Prayagraj, also known as Allahabad or Ilahabad, is a vibrant metropolis located in the Indian state of Uttar Pradesh. Famous as the site of the grand Kumbh Mela, Prayagraj is well-connected through various modes of transport.

Whether you choose to travel by train, air, or road, there are numerous options available to reach this sacred city. This guide provides comprehensive details about train connections from multiple stations, flight operators, and bus services, making it easier for you to plan your journey to Prayagraj during the Kumbh Mela.

Prayagraj: A Sacred City

Prayagraj, historically known as Prayāga, is situated near the Triveni Sangam, the sacred confluence of the Ganges, Yamuna, and the mythical Sarasvati rivers. This confluence is deeply revered in Hinduism and holds a central place in ancient Hindu scriptures. The city's origins are traced back to the Vedas, where it is referred to as one of the world's oldest cities, venerated as the holy city of Prayāga.

In the late Vedic period, Prayagraj was also known as **Kosambi**, named by the Kuru rulers of Hastinapur, who established it as their capital. Kosambi was one of the most significant cities in India during the late Vedic era and remained important through the Maurya Empire, with continued significance into the Gupta Empire. Over the centuries, Prayagraj has served as a political, cultural, and administrative center in the Doab region, playing a vital role in the history and culture of India.

By Air



All flights to Prayagraj land at Prayagraj Airport (IXD), which is located 12 km from the Kumbh Mela area. The auto fare from the airport is approximately INR 200-300. If you are unable to find a direct flight, The two other nearest airports are Lal Bahadur Shastri Airport in Varanasi (150 km) and Amausi International Airport in Lucknow (200 km). Both these airports are well-connected to major cities across India.


Daily flights from leading airlines such as Air India, GoAir, IndiGo, Jet Airways, and SpiceJet are available. From these airports, you can easily hire local cabs or board interstate buses to reach Prayagraj.

By Rail: As the headquarters of the North Central Railway Zone, Prayagraj boasts eight railway stations within its city limits, all well-connected to major cities across India. Nearby Railway Stations in Prayagraj:

- Prayagraj Junction (PRYJ): The main station, well-connected to major cities, is located 10 km from the Kumbh Mela area. Auto fare: INR 150-200.
- Prayag Junction (PRG): Situated 6 km from the Kumbh Mela area. Auto fare: INR 100-150.
- Prayagraj Rambagh (PRRB): The closest station to the Kumbh Mela area, just 4 km away. Auto fare: INR 100-150.
- Prayagraj Chheoki Junction (PCOI): Located 9 km from the Kumbh Mela area. Auto fare: INR 150-200.







How To Reach Prayagraj





Prayagraj, situated in the heartland of the great Indian plains, boasts a high road density, making it well-connected to the rest of the country through national and state highways. NH 19 (formerly NH 2), which links Delhi to Kolkata, passes through Prayagraj, while NH 30 connects Prayagraj with Lucknow. Other highways include NH 7, which links Nagpur to Prayagraj, NH 31 connecting Patna to Prayagraj, and NH 135 linking Prayagraj with Varanasi. NH 76 connects Prayagraj in Uttar Pradesh to Pindwara in Rajasthan, and NH 96 links Prayagraj with Ayodhya, two major centers of Hindu pilgrimage.

The three bus stands in Prayagraj cater to different interstate routes. Local transport options, including tourist taxis, cabs, autorickshaws, and city buses, are also available for travel within Prayagraj and nearby cities.

Key Routes to Prayagraj:

NH 19: Delhi – Prayagraj

Route: Delhi - Agra - Kanpur - Prayagraj | Distance: 650 km | Approx. Travel Time: 10-12 hours.

• NH 30: Lucknow – Prayagraj

Route: Lucknow - Raebareli - Prayagraj | Distance: 200 km | Approx. Travel Time: 4-5 hours.

• NH 31: Patna – Prayagraj

Route: Patna - Chhapra - Ballia - Prayagraj | Distance: 370 km | Approx. Travel Time: 8-9 hours.

NH 135: Varanasi – Prayagraj

Route: Varanasi - Mirzapur - Prayagraj | Distance: 120 km | Approx. Travel Time: 3-4 hours.

NH 7: Nagpur – Prayagraj

Route: Nagpur - Jabalpur - Rewa - Prayagraj | Distance: 600 km | Approx. Travel Time: 11-13 hours.

State-run Services:

The Uttar Pradesh State Road Transport Corporation (UPSRTC) operates frequent buses from Lucknow, Kanpur, and Varanasi, with departures every hour. These buses arrive at the Civil Lines Bus Stand, 8 km from the Kumbh Mela area. The auto fare from the bus stand is approximately INR 100-150.

Private Operators:

Private bus services connect Prayagraj to Delhi, Agra, and Jaipur, with 2-3 daily departures, also arriving at the Civil Lines Bus Stand. For longer routes, private operators offer Volvo, AC, and Sleeper buses from cities like Patna, Ranchi, and Kolkata.

Other State Services:

The Rajasthan State Road Transport Corporation (RSRTC) operates daily buses from Jaipur, Ajmer, and Udaipur, also terminating at the Civil Lines Bus Stand, providing convenient access to the Kumbh Mela area.



Attractions In Maha - Kumbh 2025



The Triveni Sangam in Prayagraj is the sacred confluence of three rivers: the Ganges, Yamuna, and the mythical Sarasvati. This holy site holds immense spiritual significance in Hinduism, as it is believed that bathing here cleanses one of sins and aids in attaining salvation. The Sangam is a central pilgrimage destination, especially during the Kumbh Mela, drawing millions of devotees seeking divine blessings and spiritual upliftment.

The Hanuman Mandir in Prayagraj is a unique and revered temple, famous for its large, reclining idol of Lord Hanuman. Located near the Triveni Sangam, this temple holds special significance as it is one of the few in India where Hanuman is depicted in a reclining posture. Devotees believe that a visit to this temple before taking a dip in the Sangam enhances the spiritual merit. During the Kumbh Mela, the temple attracts millions of pilgrims seeking blessings for protection and strength.





The Ganga Aarti in Prayagraj is a beautiful and spiritual ritual performed daily at the banks of the holy River Ganges, particularly at the Sangam. The evening aarti, with its mesmerizing chants, ringing bells, and flaming lamps, is a tribute to the sacred river, symbolizing purification and devotion. Devotees gather to witness this divine ceremony, offering prayers and seeking blessings from the Ganga. The aarti during special occasions, like the Kumbh Mela, draws large crowds, enhancing the spiritual atmosphere of the city.
